	Take the ASVAB during your junior year

	Visit colleges that interest you. Sign up for a tour so they know you're there and you'll get the full benefit of your visit. Some schools offer scholarships if you visit their campus and decide to attend school there.	
	Finalize your list of colleges and programs you are interested in.	
	Register with NCAA Clearinghouse if you plan on participating in D1 or D2 college athletics.	
	Register for fall entrance exams	

SENIOR YEAR

September/October:		
	Depending on your plans the requirements of your college choices, register and take	
	one or more of these tests. Be sure to send your scores directly from the testing site to	
	the colleges of your choice.

	□ ASVAB	
	Apply for FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) as close to October	
	1st as possible.	
	You will need letters of recommendations from teachers and/or coaches. Make sure you	
	ask well in advance of the letters being due	
November-January		
	Complete all required parts of each application, either on the Internet or on paper	
	Submit each application on time. Look at deadlines carefully, especially if you are	
	applying for Early Decision or Early Action. Proofread each application before you send	
	it and print a copy for your files	
	Have a transcript sent to the colleges that you apply to	
	ry-February	
	Confirm colleges have all necessary materials from you	
	Re-send transcripts if necwessary	
	Don't get senioritis! Colleges will want to see your second semester grades too.	
March-April		
	You will start receiving admissions decisions and financial aid awards. Read everything	
	carefully and discuss it with your family. Some of it may require action on your part	
	Make a final decision and mail the enrollment form and deposit check to the school you	
	select BEFORE THE DEADLINE.	
	Notify each school to which you were accepted but will not be attending and so that your	
	spot can be freed up for another student	
	If you are on a waiting list, contact the Admissions Office and let them know if you are	
	still interested in the spot. If you are, updated them on your spring grades and activities.
